## Asahidake

Asahidake has put on it's winter coat. While the snow around Sugatami Pond has melted, it will return soon, settling on the trails and capturing the footprints of the wildlife. There is a chill in the air so be sure to wrap up warm when you visit.

## Walking path

There is often snow on the path at this time of the year. Even if the snow has melted, the path is wet and muddy. You can rent rubber boots at both the Asahidake Visitor center and the Ropeway Sugatami (top) Station.

The Hagoromo waterfall sits at the end of the walking path. There is also a foot bath at the carpark and onsen facilities at Shikishimasou. **Note: There is no public toilet at Tenninkyou. The nearest toilet is Asahidake Gensui (spring) park.**

## Helpful information for walking in the SugatamiPond Area

Usual temperature in Mid-October: -7°C - +6°C

★We recommend rainwear and rubber boots on rainy days.

★Expect late autumn/early winter conditions at Asahidake.
